After six years, we have some changes afoot at Vets on Waiheke and Waiheke Vets.



We are moving! On 31 August 2020 our Oneroa Vet Clinic at 3 Tui Street will close permanently and relocate to our Ostend Vet Clinic at 30 Putiki Road!

Merging the two clinics gives us an opportunity streamline and enhance our services by providing a ONE-STOP treatment, surgery, dispensing and retail location for our animal community.

To accommodate this change, we have recently expanded our Ostend clinic to include an additional, large consultation room, extra waiting room (with coffee machine ) and we will have two vets consulting daily. We also have a new telephone system operational from this week to further

ensure that our clients get the best service possible and will continue to expand other areas of the clinic over the next months.

We realise that closing our Tui Street clinic will impact some long-standing clients in the Oneroa area, so to make the transition easier, we will be offering a free delivery service for purchases, over the phone/online payments for items being delivered, as well as a pickup/drop off service for clients without transport, who need to bring an animal in for a consultation.



We will always carry as much stock as space will allow, however there's no guarantee that all stock will always be on our shelves, so advance/pre-ordering is essential to ensure that your pets receive their food, treats, toys and prescription medications before they run out! Our suppliers are super efficient,

we can therefore have most pre-ordered goods on the island within 48 hours.

We thank all our clients for their support and patience with the transition and look forward to this exciting new chapter and the

opportunity to continue to improve and expand on the services we offer to the animals of our beautiful island
